1d **Completed :** _____

Make a list of different ways to communicate. **Be prepared to discuss** examples or instances for each communication type listed and **be prepared to discuss** as to when each method might not be appropriate or effective. Be prepared means you must be able to explain and describe the various examples of communication techniques. Although you don't have to write down the explanations, you can and this would certainly show that you are prepared to discuss them.

2a **Completed :** _____

You will need to **deliver a presentation** that should be 2 to 4 minutes long to tell your patrol and counselor about yourself. A suggestion would be to state some facts about yourself and your family, your hobbies and things you like to do, most importantly, something interesting about you. For this presentation you must **create some kind of aid** like a collage, PowerPoint presentation, drawings, pictures etc and use it to help make your presentation more interesting. A presentation of talk along is boring, use the aid to make it interesting.

3 **Completed :** _____

You must **Write out a Speech** that should last from 4 to 5 minutes. Then you must **Deliver the Speech**. The speech must be fully formed in writing; you can not just make an outline and then ad lib to make it 4-5 minutes long. Practice the speech a few times but you don't have to memorize it. Read the Communications Merit Badge book on how to construct the speech. The speech must be at least 4 minutes long and try to make it exciting. Don't repeat yourself and it must be original, you can't site the Gettysburg Address.

4 **Completed :** _____

Interview somebody, take notes about that person and learn some interesting facts. Then **prepare a written** introduction for that person that will last about a minute. You will need to **deliver the introduction** to your patrol and counselor. Pretend that person is coming with you to the Scout Meeting to give a speech to your patrol. What would you say about that person? How would you introduce that person to your patrol?



5 **Completed :** _____

We will be visiting the Somerville Town Council meeting to satisfy this requirement. **You must pay attention at the meeting and while actively listening, you must take notes of what was said.** Then you must **write an Objective Report** to summarize the meeting, see the Communication Merit Badge Book for details. At a future scout meeting, you will then **present the Object Report to your counselor.** Pretend your counselor was not at the meeting and you are reporting back to him/her everything that was discussed at the Town Council.

6 **Completed :** _____

For this requirement you will be assigned a topic that you must present to your patrol and counselor. You will need to **research the topic** then **develop a plan** and **create a presentation aid.** The aid could be a poster, flip chart or a single page handout. Outline the topic and include pictures or other visual elements.

7c **Completed :** _____

Using a desktop publishing tool you will **create a Troop 84 Recruitment Brochure.** This brochure you will highlight one or more things about our troop that you like and that would attract new scouts to the troop. Make it sound and look good. Refer to the Communications Merit Badge Book on how to create a Tri-Fold Brochure. The tri-fold brochure will have three columns evenly distributed over a normal notebook size page. When properly folded the first column will be the Front cover which will then open up to two narrow pages inside. The first column design should be an attractive cover page. The next two columns should have info and pictures of something you like to do in the troop. The brochure must have one photo or illustration. The best three designs will win an award
